Notice of the Passing of a Zoning By-Law

Pursuant to Section 34(18) of the *Planning Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c. P.13, as amended

Take notice that the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Bradford West Gwillimbury passed By-law 2018-56 amending Zoning By-law 2010-050 on the 19th day of June, 2018 under section 34 of the *Planning Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c. P.13, as amended, in respect of lands located in Part of Lot 15, Concession 5, being Part 4 on Plan 51R-12216, and municipally known as 617 Simcoe Road. A key map showing the location of the lands to which the by-law applies is attached.

The purpose of By-law 2018-56 is to rezone the lands from the Future Development "FD" Zone to the Residential One Exception "R1-1*9" Zone to permit the construction of a single detached dwelling with an accessory dwelling unit, and to recognize the existing height of the remaining accessory building (used as a workshop for a commercial fabrication and welding home occupation). The complete by-law is available for public inspection during regular office hours at the Office of Community Planning, 305 Barrie Street, Unit 2, Bradford.

Any person or public body may appeal to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal (LPAT) in respect of Council's decision by filing with Rebecca Murphy, Clerk, of The Corporation of the Town of Bradford West Gwillimbury, 100 Dissette Street, Units 7 & 8, P.O. Box 100, Bradford, Ontario, L3Z 2A7, **not later than the 18th day of July, 2018**, a notice of appeal which must set out the reasons for the appeal and must be accompanied by the LPAT form and fee of \$300.00 payable to the Minister of Finance.

In conformity with section 34(18) of the *Planning Act*, regard has been had for all written and oral submissions received before the decision was made in relation to this planning matter, as considered in Report DES 2018 20. The report is available for viewing on the municipal website at bit.ly/2I6CivW or by contacting the Office of Community Planning at planninginfo@townofbwg.com.

Only individuals, corporations, and public bodies may appeal a zoning by-law to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal. A notice of appeal may not be filed by an unincorporated association or group. However, a notice of appeal may be filed in the name of an individual who is a member of the association or group on its behalf. If you wish to appeal to the LPAT, the appeal forms are available from the LPAT website at www.elto.gov.on.ca.

No person or public body shall be added as a party to the hearing of the appeal unless, before the By-law was passed, the person or public body made oral submissions at a public meeting or written submissions to the Council of the Town of Bradford West Gwillimbury or, in the opinion of the Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to add the person or public body as a party.

BWG BY-LAWS

LAWN WATERING AND CAR WASHING

QUESTION:

What are ... things that are not allowed when a "Level 1" water restriction is in effect to ensure adequate water supply.

Please review the notice below to be aware of upcoming work that may affect municipal water users in BWG.

NOTICE:

Innisfil Water Treatment Plant Upgrades

WHAT'S HAPPENING:

Upgrades are being made to the Innisfil Lakeshore Water Treatment Plant (WTP) in order to serve the growing populations of both Innisfil and Bradford West Gwillimbury. During the month of July, several brief shut-downs will take place at the WTP for the switch over to the new system.

HOW YOU MAY BE AFFECTED:

There will likely be no impact to residents, since BWG's tap water comes from two sources: the Innisfil WTP and the BWG Church Wells. While the WTP is shut down, we anticipate that water supply from the wells will be more than sufficient to meet all needs.

The Town is asking residents to be aware of restrictions that could be implemented if necessary to maintain adequate water supply for all residents, as well as emergency purposes. For example, if the planned shut-downs were to coincide with long stretches of hot, dry weather, residents could be asked to limit non-essential water use for a short time.

IF WATER RESTRICTIONS ARE REQUIRED, residents will receive 72 hours' notice via methods including Facebook, Twitter, the Town's website and local news media. Restrictions would be in place for approximately 24-48 hours.

As per Town of BWG By-law 2014-17, restrictions that could be imposed include:

- No lawn watering, car washing or other outdoor water use (such as recreational sprinkler use, etc.)
- Town splash pads will be shut down
- The Town will suspend maintenance activities such as water main and sewer flushing and any sodding operations

Please keep an eye on the media mentioned above for updates throughout the next several weeks. Thank you for your cooperation and patience during this work.
