DID YOU KNOW?

- Children 1-4 years of age most often drown in backyard pools.
- Drowning can occur in as little as 10-20 seconds, in only centimetres of water.
- Most drownings occur when the caregiver is not paying attention, even for a second. Parents/Caregivers need to be "On Guard".

BACKYARD POOL SAFETY TIPS

1. Appoint an adult to actively supervise any children at the pool at all times - the Lifesaving Society's On Guard card is a handy tool and reminder, with useful tips.
2. Keep children under five within arms' reach in and around the water.
3. Control and restrict access to water - a latching gate and four-sided fencing can prevent accidents and unintended access to the water.
4. Use the Lifesaving Society's Backyard Pool Safety Inspections Guidelines with the Backyard Pool Checklist.
