



Notice of Decision
Extension of Interim Control By-law 2019-61
Pursuant to Section 38 of the
Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. P.13, as amended

Take notice that the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Bradford West Gwillimbury passed By-law 2020-16 on the 3rd day of March, 2020, to extend Interim Control By-law 2019-61 to June 18, 2021.

The purpose and effect of Interim Control By-law 2019-61 is to prohibit the establishment of Cannabis Micro Cultivation Operations on those lands zoned Agricultural (A), Marsh Agricultural (AM), Rural (RU) and Natural Heritage System Two (NHS2) for a period of one year in order to allow for the appropriate completion of research and consultation related to the use of lands as Cannabis Micro-Cultivation Operations. Council by resolution directed that the necessary research and consultation be undertaken with respect to developing land use planning policies and regulations concerning Cannabis Micro Cultivation Operations on all the lands zoned Agricultural (A), Marsh Agricultural (AM), Rural (RU) and Natural Heritage System Two (NHS2) located within the Town of Bradford West Gwillimbury.

The Council of The Corporation of the Town of Bradford West Gwillimbury has authority to amend By-law 2019-061 to extend the period of time during which the by-law will be in effect, provided the total period of time does not exceed two years from the date of the passing of the By-law. Interim Control By-law 2019-61 was originally in effect from June 18, 2019 to June 18, 2020. By-law 2020-16 extends Interim Control By-law 2020-16 until June 18, 2021 to enable the completion of the policies and regulations to manage and control cannabis uses.

Any person or public body may appeal the amending by-law to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal (LPAT) by filing with Rebecca Murphy, Clerk, of The Corporation of the Town of Bradford West Gwillimbury, 100 Dissette Street, Units 7 & 8, P.O. Box 100, Bradford, Ontario, L3Z 2A7, **not later than the 4th day of May, 2020**, a notice of appeal which must set out the reasons for an appeal and must be accompanied by the LPAT form and required fee payable to the Minister of Finance. If you wish to appeal to LPAT, the forms are available from the LPAT website at <http://elto.gov.on.ca/tribunals/lpat/forms>.

Only individuals, corporations and public bodies may appeal an interim control by-law to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal. A notice of appeal may not be filed by an unincorporated association or group. However, a notice of appeal may be filed in the name of an individual who is a member of the association or the group on its behalf.
